Articles of Faith

CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS

1. WE BELIEVE in God, the Eternal Father, and in His Son, Jesus Christ, and in the Holy Ghost.
2. WE BELIEVE that men will be punished for their own sins, and not for Adam's transgression.
3. WE BELIEVE that through the Atonement of Christ, all mankind may be saved, by obedience to the laws and ordinances of the Gospel.
4. WE BELIEVE that the first principles and ordinances of the Gospel are: first, Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; second, Repentance; third, Baptism by immersion for the remission of sins; fourth, Laying on of hands for the gift of the Holy Ghost.
5. WE BELIEVE that a man must be called of God, by prophecy, and by the laying on of hands, by those who are in authority to preach the Gospel and administer in the ordinances thereof.

8. WE BELIEVE the Bible to be the word of God as far as it is translated correctly; we also believe the Book of Mormon to be the word of God.
9. WE BELIEVE all that God has revealed, all that He does now reveal, and we believe that He will yet reveal many great and important things pertaining to the Kingdom of God.
10. WE BELIEVE in the literal gathering of Israel and in the restoration of the Ten Tribes; that Zion will be built upon this (the American) continent; that Christ will reign personally upon the earth; and, that the earth will be renewed and receive its paradisiacal glory.
11. WE CLAIM the privilege of worshipping Almighty God according to the dictates of our own conscience, and allow all men the same privilege, let them worship how, where, or what they may.
12. WE BELIEVE in being subject to kings, presidents, rulers and magistrates, in obeying, honoring, and sustaining the law.
13. WE BELIEVE in being honest, true, chaste, benevolent, virtuous, and in doing good to all men; indeed, we may say that we follow the admonition of Paul—We believe all things, we hope all things, we have endured many things, and hope to be able to endure all things. If there is anything virtuous, lovely, or of good report or praiseworthy, we seek after these things.

TO KEEP OR NOT TO KEEP—Just what records should be destroyed and what should be kept is not always a simple question, as county officials realized when they called in experts from the state archives department to advise them on the matter. County Establishes Storage For Records It Must Keep

Utah County has found use for the old infirmary laundry building as a waterproof, fireproof storehouse for old records. The building as a separate structure from the old infirmary itself.

Commissioners were informed by Utah State Archives records manager Ferdinand Johnson that some records must be kept only 10 years; then may be destroyed.

Other records must be kept permanently and are microfilmed.

The county hired former Sheriff

Theron S. Hall on an hourly basis as records officer, and began destruction of records which need not be retained.

It will take a month to get rid of this backlog of outdated records says G. Marion Hinckley, commission chairman.

Henceforth, each year, non-permanent records 11 years old will be destroyed.

IBM cards are shredded instead of burned, and have salvage value of \$26 a ton.

Moving out the old records will give crowded county offices many cubic feet more of filing space, said the commissioner.

Last week, space equivalent to 17 legal sized filing cabinets was cleared of old records.

The destroyed records consisted mainly of car tax receipts and personal property assessment sheets from the county assessor's office, and warrants from the auditor's office dating back to 1131.

The cinder block laundry will house temporary records in sealed cartons on 10-foot high shelves.

The shelves will cost \$700, but filing cabinets in the county building to provide the same space would cost \$9000, said Mr. Johnson.

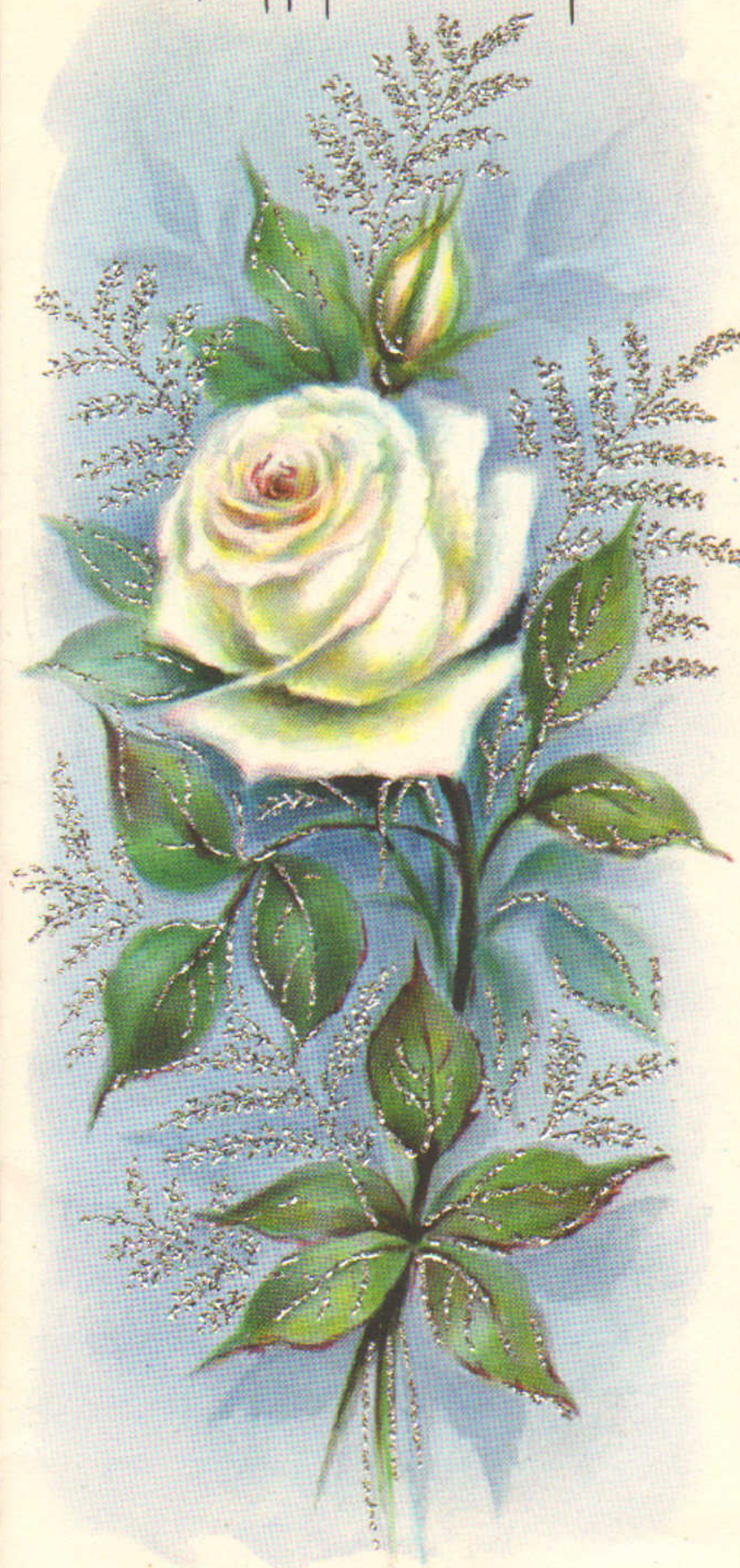

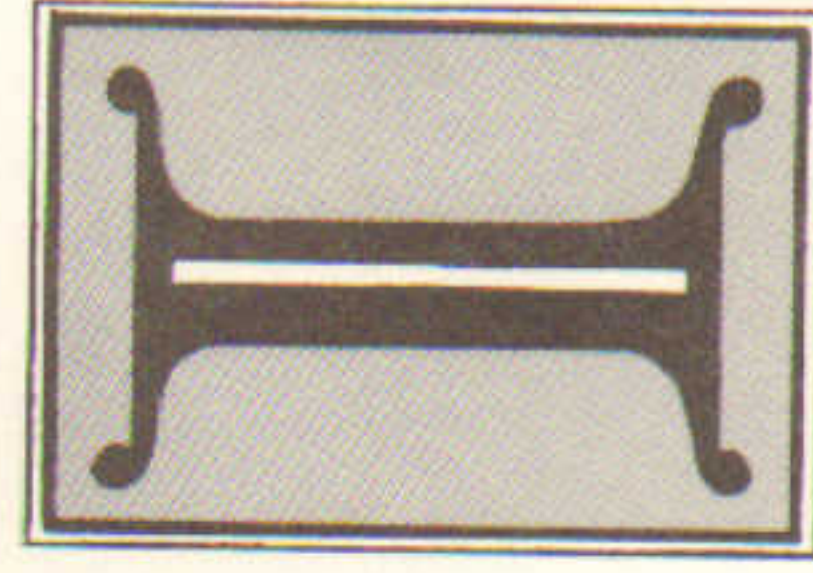

The Saviour did tell.

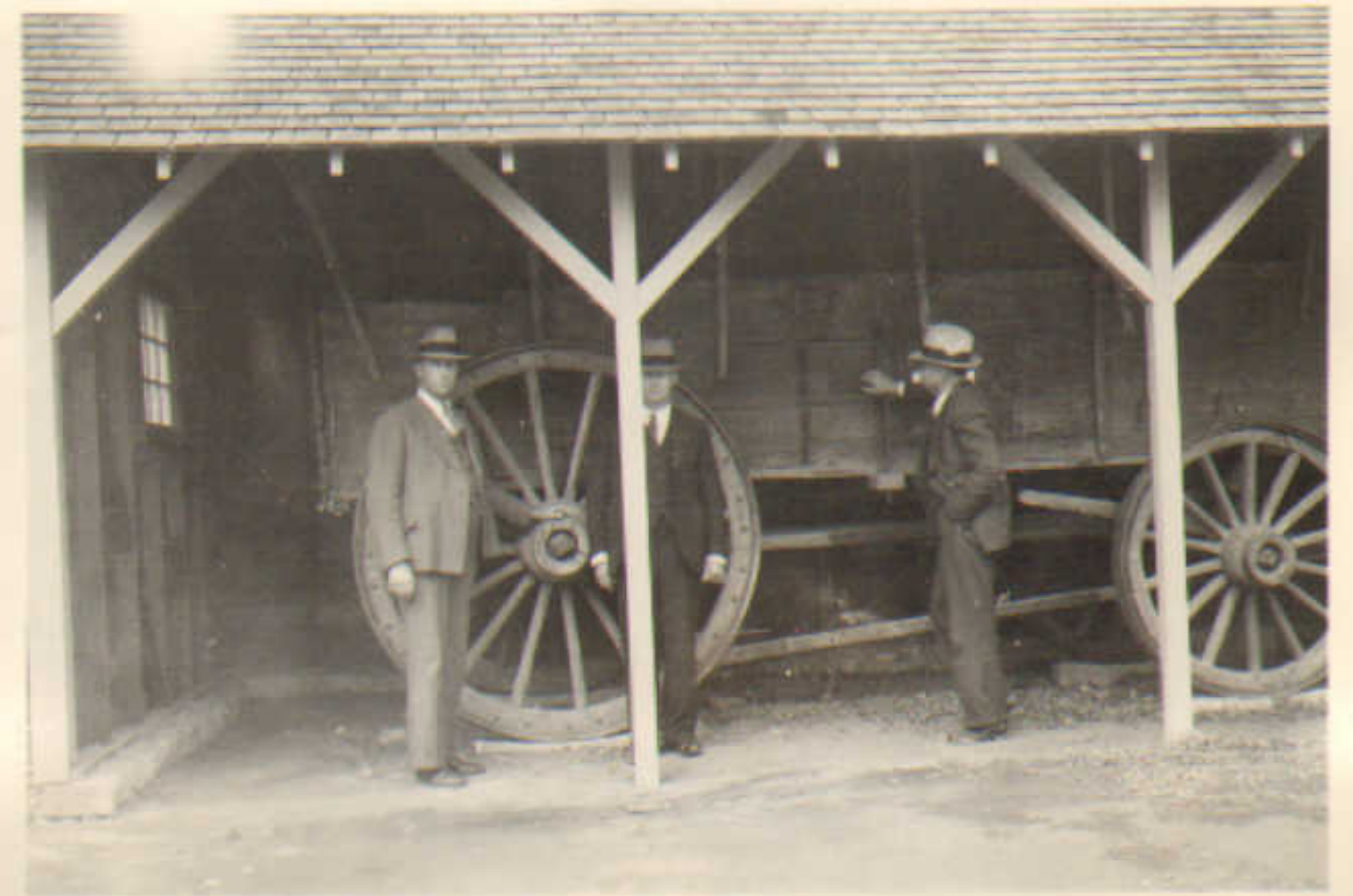

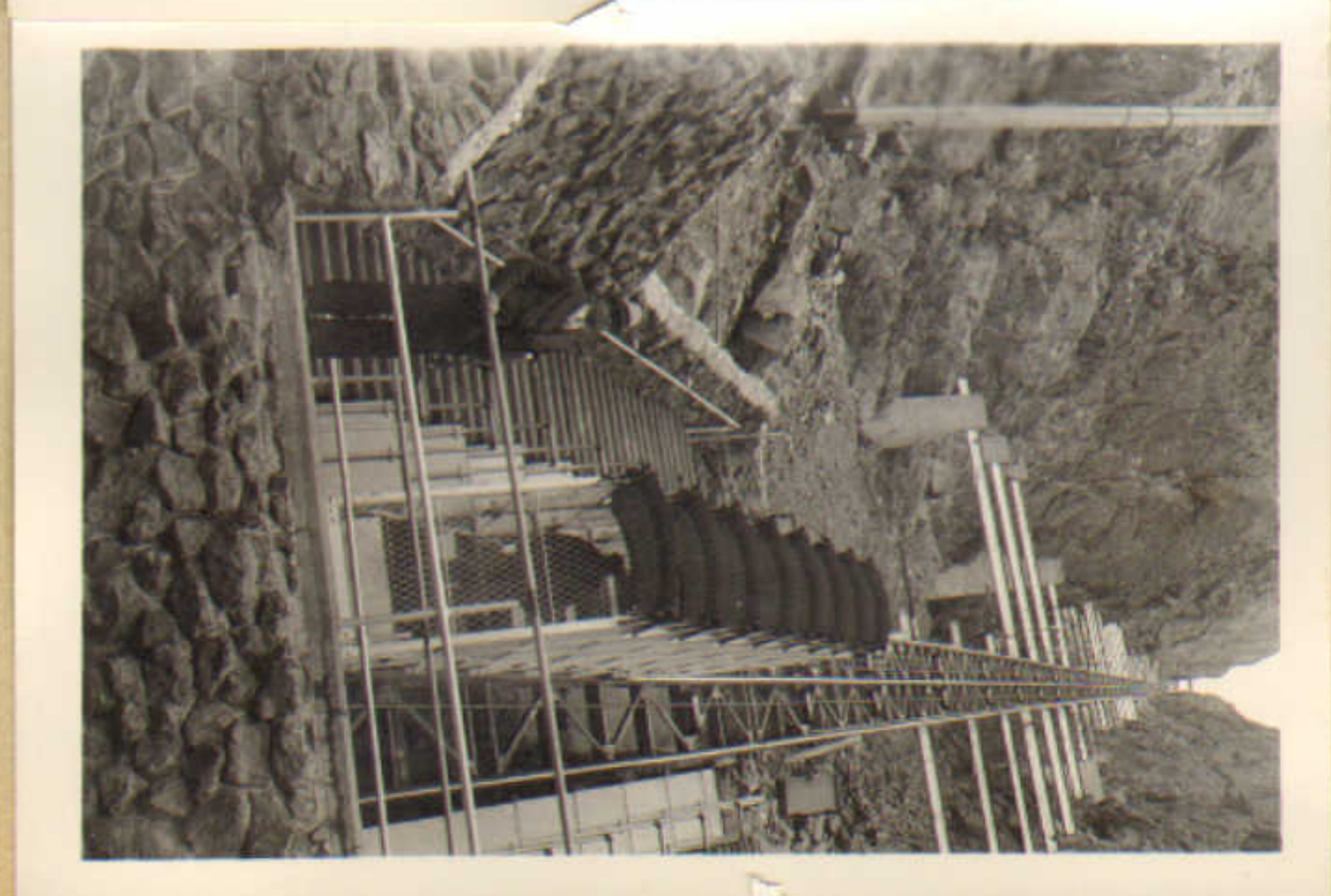

Life is made richer and more pleasant for those who work at the Genealogical Society Library because of the pleasing environmental contributions of Brother and Sister Theron Hall of Springville. Here they are shown behind a lovely bouquet of mock-orange blossoms which graces the desk of Sister Mary Howard of the library's General Reference section.

Springville had its beginning in the Fall of 1850. Shortly thereafter, probably early in 1851, The Springville Ward was organized with Aaron Johnson as bishop and William Miller and Myron P. Crandall as counselors.

Utah Stake was organized on 27 September 1878 with Brigham O. Smoot as stake president. It encompassed Utah County and Springville Ward was a part of Utah Stake.

Nephi Packard was bishop of the Springville Ward when it was subdivided into four wards on 17 April 1892. The bishops sustained on that date were: 1st Ward--John Tucket; 2nd Ward--Loren Harmer; 3rd Ward--George R. Hill and 4th Ward--Joseph Lloyd.

In November 1924, Kolob Stake was organized at the Utah Stake Quarterly Conference. George Ray Maycock was sustained as stake president with J. Frank Bringham and Edwin M. Snow as counselors. Claude G. Salisbury was called as stake clerk. The new stake consisted of four wards in Springville, a ward in Mapleton and branches in Thistle and Soldiers Summit. R. Lovell Mendenhall had been sustained as bishop of the Mapleton Ward six months earlier. On the day the stake was organized four new bishops were sustained: 1st Ward--J. Emmett Bird; 2nd Ward--William Wainwright; 3rd Ward--Henry Ralph Smart; 4th Ward--Hilton A. Robertson.

President Maycock died 16 November 1930. J. Emmett Bird was sustained as stake president in January 1931. During his administration J. Frank Bringham, Edwin M. Snow, Hilton A. Robertson, C. R. Jones, William Harmer and Claude G. Salisbury served as counselors. Claude G. Salisbury and John L. Whiting served as clerks.

Ernest A. Strong was sustained as stake president of Kolob Stake October 1943. His counselors were Andrew G. Peterson and Glen W. Sumsion with Ernest A. Strong, Jr. and William Greenhalgh as clerks.

In 1944 the 5th and 6th Wards were organized. J. Y. Bearnson was sustained as bishop of the 5th Ward with Clarence Jensen and Paul Haymond as counselors. Erwin Sheffield was sustained as Bishop of the 6th Ward with Jack Cherrington and Lloyd Ashcraft as counselors.

The 7th, 8th and 9th Wards were organized in 1948 and the following bishoprics were sustained: 7th Ward--Theron S. Hall as bishop with Jesse H. Whiting and Edgar A. Best as counselors; 8th Ward--Leo A. Crandall as bishop with Edward H. Boyer and Richard A. Huntington as counselors; 9th Ward--Wilford W. Clyde as bishop with Clarence L. Jensen and Thayne Laney as counselors.

Leo A. Crandall was sustained as president of the Kolob Stake in March 1954. His counselors were Perry D. Goodliffe and Glenn A. Christenson. Stake clerks were Ernest A. Strong, Jr., Howard C. Maycock and Clarence L. Jensen.

The 10th, 11th, and 12th Wards were organized in July 1956. J. Grant Nielson was sustained as bishop of the 10th Ward. Robert Bishop and Waldo E. Jacobson were his counselors.

The Kolob Stake was divided on 21 October 1956 and the Springville Stake was organized. Leo A. Crandall was sustained as president with Glenn A. Christensen and Howard C. Maycock as counselors. Blaine P. Clyde and F. Calvin Packard were clerks. Later, Clarence L. Jensen served as a counselor to president Crandall.

The 13th Ward was organized on 25 June 1967. Edward W. Holmes was sustained as bishop, Richard Schultz and Ridge Phillips as counselors.

Grant S. Thorn was sustained as president of the Springville Stake in November 1970. F. Calvin Packard and Vernon J. Tipton were sustained as counselors with Bliss Packard as executive secretary and Frank Springer, Wendell Winger, Ralph Jacobson, Clarence Jensen and Berton Groesbeck as clerks.
