Mr. J. Cecil Alter informs us that he is unable to supply you with meteorological instruments for the reason that Utah County already has its quota of Government stations, so we are sending you one of our rain gages.

Your station will be numbered U-1 and we would prefer to have it so designated in your monthly reports to the station on the forms furnished.

You will observe that the area used in catching the rainfall is ten times the area of the vessel receiving it and hence the recorded readings will be one-tenth of the reading of the measuring stick.

Should there be anyone elsewhere in your county (we should not wish to have the stations too close together) who might be interested in this work we should very greatly appreciate it if you would refer them to us.

If there is any information you may need from time to time please let us know and we shall be glad to help you.





Hall Utah County Sheriff Provo, Utah Dear Sheriff: It is my recollection that in 1950 when I ran for the office of Justice of this Court you seemed somewhat interested in the subject of speeding up legal procedures without sacrificing efficiency or justice. By way of report, I thought you might be interested in the enclosure. This of course does not imply that I claim personal responsibility for the excellent shape our calendar is in. It is in fact due to the very fine cooperation of all five members of the Court. But the happy truth is that as of now, for the first time anyone can remember, opinions have been written in all of the cases submitted to us, as compared to a constant average back-log of several dozen cases for many years past. It is also noteworthy that within the past few years we have by special settings and proceedings handled very expeditiously a number of cases of great public importance; and the average time in disposing of cases is much less than it used to be. My association with you is numbered among the pleasant recollections of that very busy summer. I felt that you might like to hear from me and this enclosure provided an additional incentive to write. 
